## Our Pastor



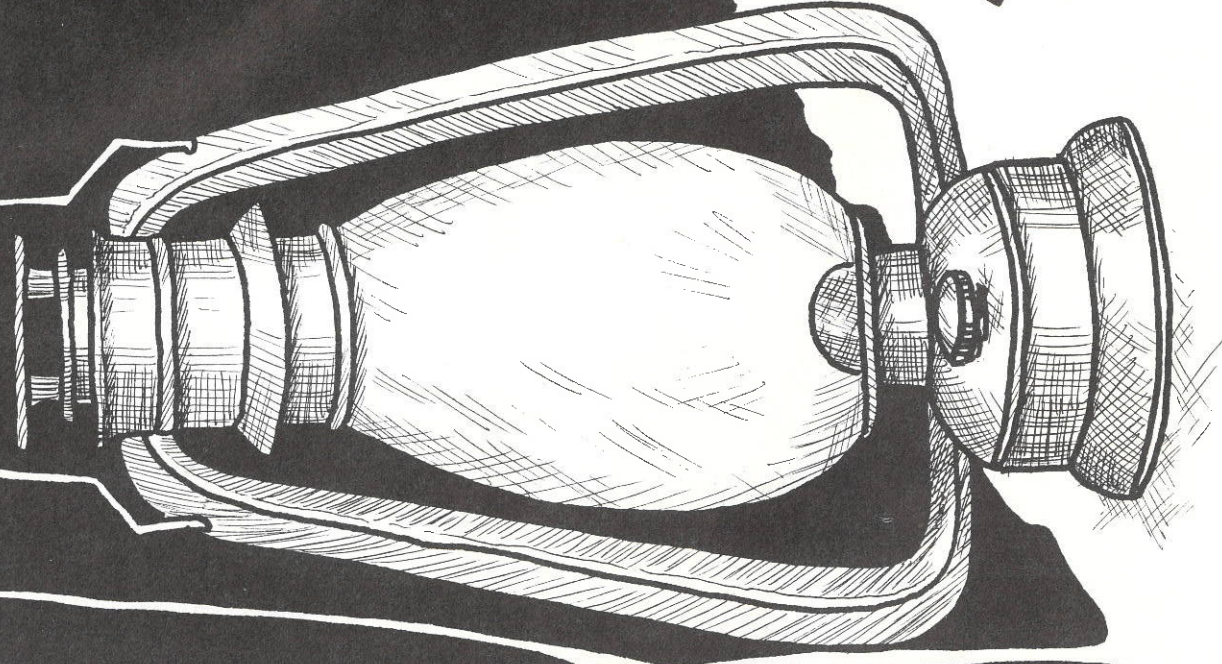

Dear Youth,



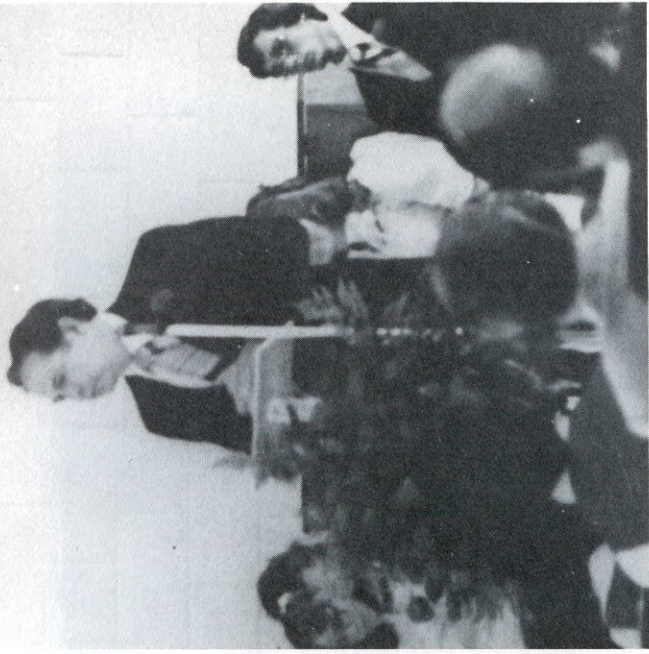

The message and inspiration of the Connells were not only left on the bulletin boards but in the hearts of both staff and students.

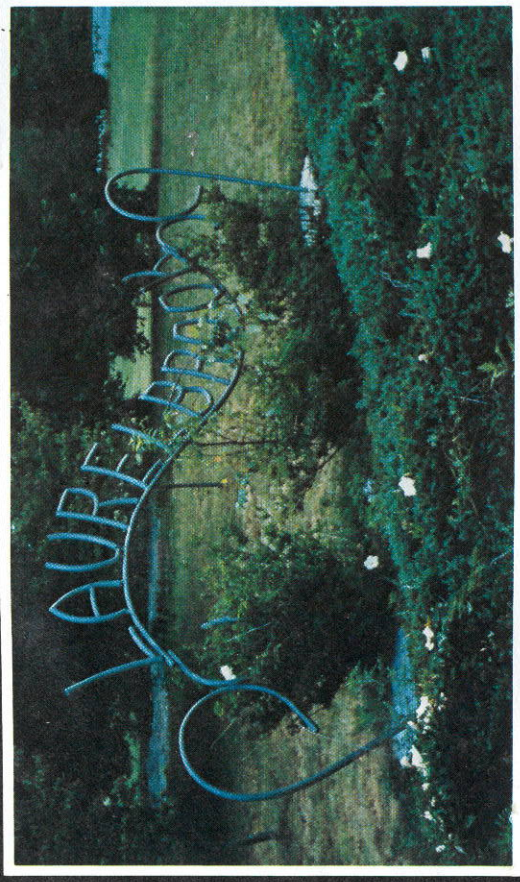
