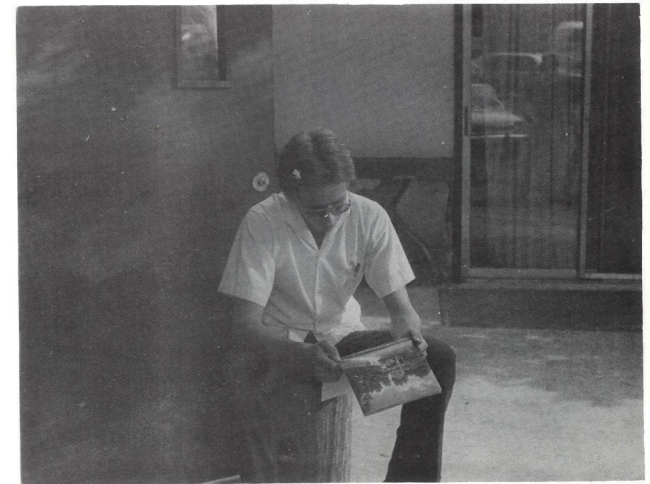

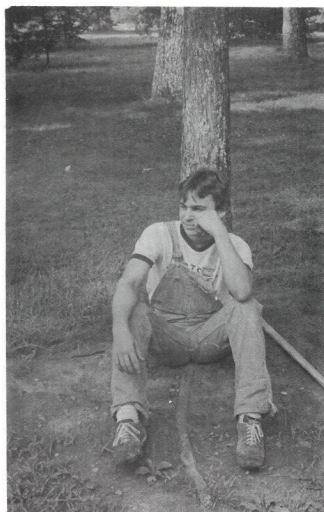

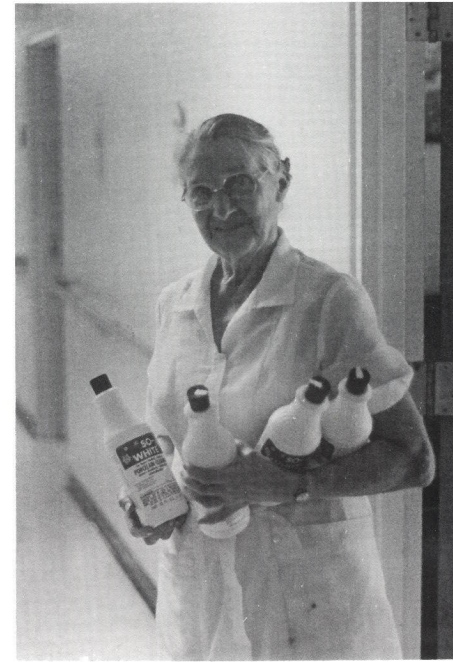


Dear Students,
