"I realized how much practical training is useful to a young person. God's help and simple means can make life more different. I want to walk where Jesus walked." Markku Heinanen.

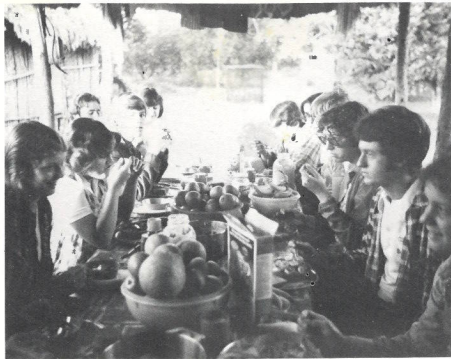
