As never before we can see the fulfilling of the signs that point to the end of the world and the coming of Jesus.

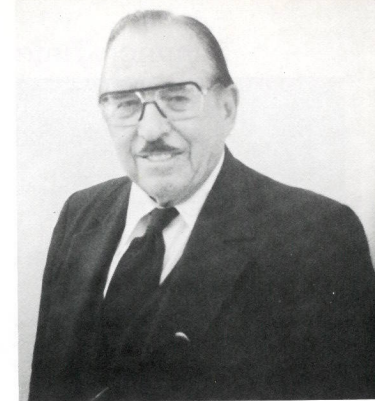

 I had merely touched shoulders with you?

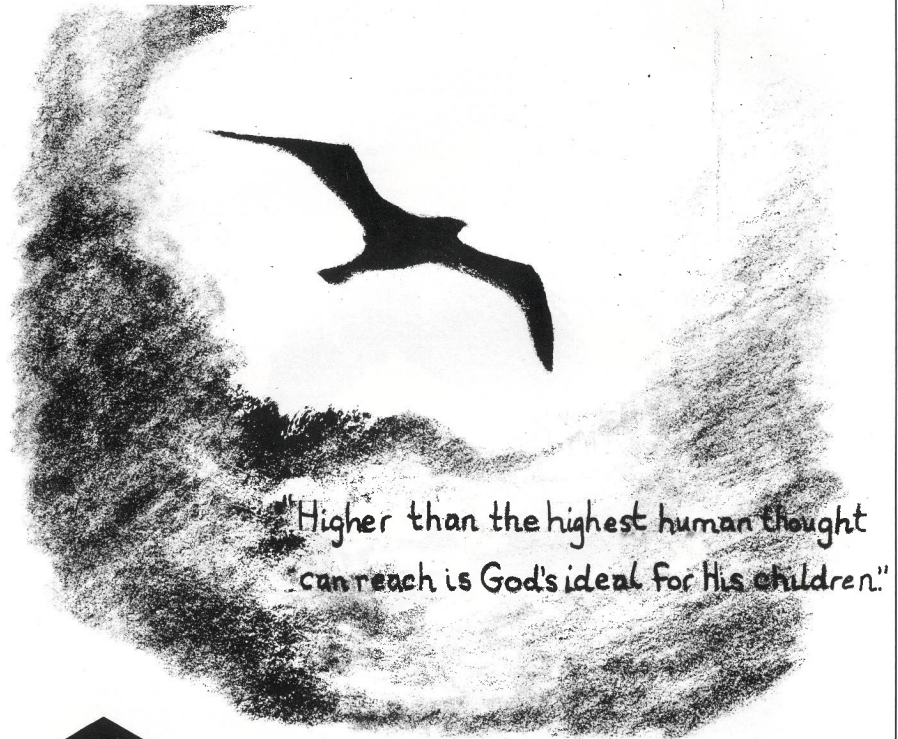


I am glad that I live, that I battle and strive

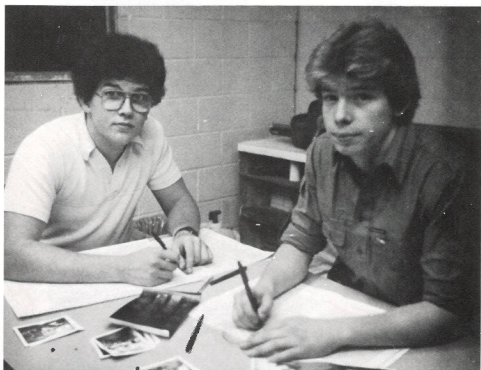
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Friendship Lasts
