WHEREVER YOU GO, WHATEVER YOU DO OR BECOME, REMEMBER TO HONOR THESE IDEALS.

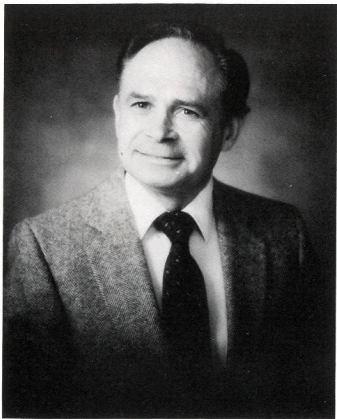

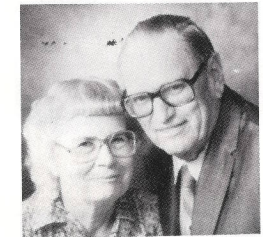
To love as gently as I can;

From The Pastor's Desk

WHAT IS HONOR?

Permit me to share with you some of the meanings and connotations of one of the most important words in any language, that of HONOR. There are at least two definitions given in the encyclopedia:

"To worship or respect - to dignify or venerate; to show esteem or manifest a high regard for standards and moral principles; also to show respect to dignitaries, as judges, clergy, parents and children. And to act in a dignified manner in one's relationship with all mankind."

This is quite imposing and comprehensive. It covers all the relationships of the human family in religious as well as civil matters.

HONOR is mentioned over fifty times in thirty-seven of the sixty-six books that comprise the Sacred Scriptures. It is brought out in twenty-two books of the Old Testament and in fifteen books of the New Testament. Let us notice some of these statements as they apply to God, to the church, to leaders, families, wives and husbands:

To God--"Fear God. Honor the king." I Timothy 2:17

To elders--"Let the elders that rule well be counted worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in word and doctrine." I Timothy 5:17

To parents--"Honor thy father and thy mother." Ephesians 2:6

To a wife--"You married men should live with an intelligent recognition of the marriage relationship, honoring the women." I Peter 3:7, Amplified New Testament

To a husband--"Let the wife see that she respects, regards and honors, loves and admires him." Ephesians 5:33, Amplified New Testament

These are clear directives from God who created us and ordained marriage, the family and the home. When we so honor as God has directed, there will be peace in the home, power in the church and tranquility in the nation. And heaven will be assured at our Lord's coming.

Soon it will be graduation day at Laurelbrook School and those who have finished their course will be honored by receiving a well-earned diploma. We trust they will pursue goals to prepare for even greater service for the blessed Lord Jesus.

And when all earthly graduations are over and the great Graduation Day comes when God of the universe steps forth presenting diplomas, may every student with their families together with all on this campus receive God's summa cum praise. And we will if we have by our lives and actions held high God's standards and moral principles with dignity and honor by His infinite grace. Then we can live in the "golden city where the golden houses are."

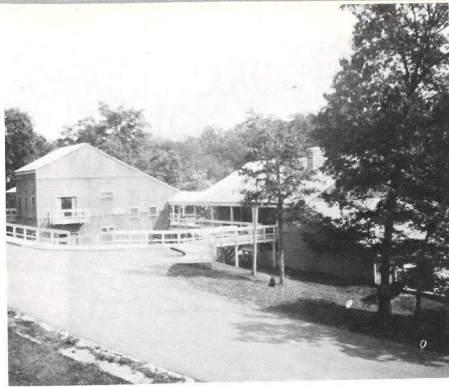

When you were in the third grade, and mother went to work full time for Florida Hospital, you decided to take up the lawn business. So for the next few years you paid your tuition and always had money in savings.

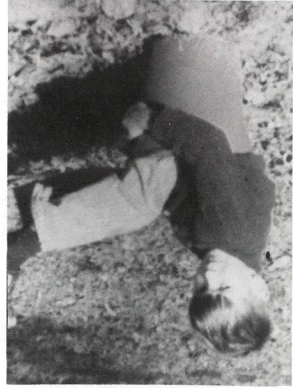
The reason you were so successful, Rusky, is because you were faithful and paid the lord his percent first.
