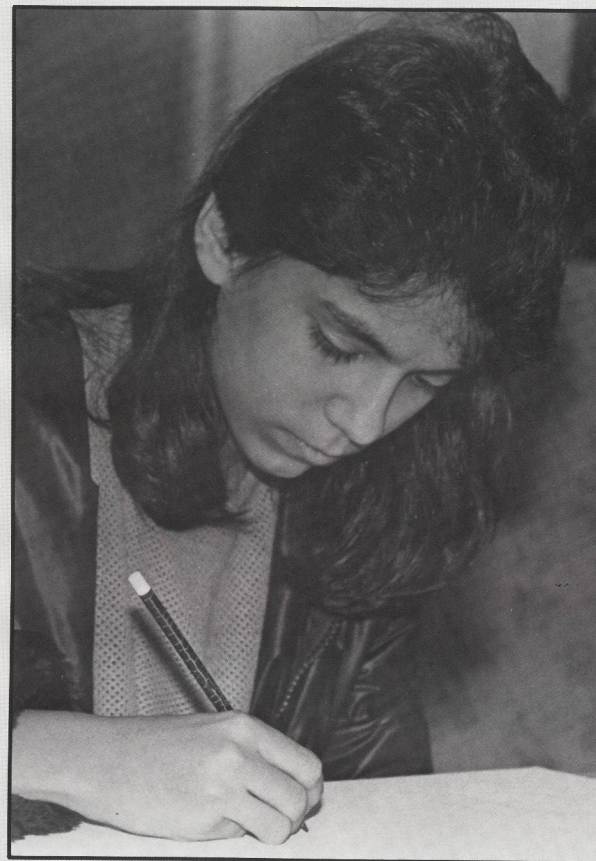


MR. RUEL EDMISTER
