the closing moments of men and women whose lives have been closely tied with this school for many years, the work opportunities that have been the privilege of the staff members and students alike,

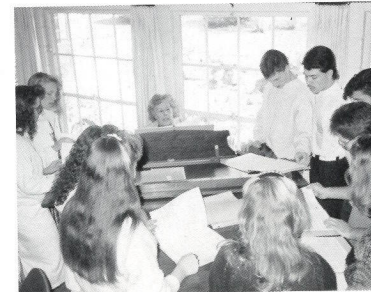


the trips to foreign mission fields, and the communion with God in nature on the Sabbath hikes. The joys and sorrows of another school year lie bound within these covers.



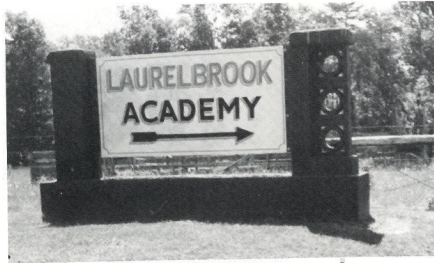
