



OUR TRUE COLORS.....SHINING THROUGH

"Our True Colors Shining Through." To each person, this statement may mean something different. To some, it is the way you talk or act when placed in different situations. Others see it in the light of the way you perform in work or at school. Then there are those who think of it when viewing your life's pattern.

To help us understand this phrase a little better, perhaps we should reword it to say "Our True Loyalties Shining Through." Our actions, when others are around and especially when we think others aren't around, show whose side we are really on. Jesus said, "Wherefore, by their fruits ye shall know them..Not everyone that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of My Father, who is in heaven" (Matthew 7:20-21). Jesus also said, "Every good tree bringeth forth good fruit, but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree can not bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit" (Matthew 7:17-18). Just as the tree cannot bring forth fruit that is good if it is not, neither can we. Others will know where our loyalties lie by the kind of life our actions testify to.

Every day is a battle, and every day we must choose whom we will serve. There is no middle ground. Sooner or later everyone will know whose side we are on. They may not hear it directly from our lips, but our actions will tell them.



