

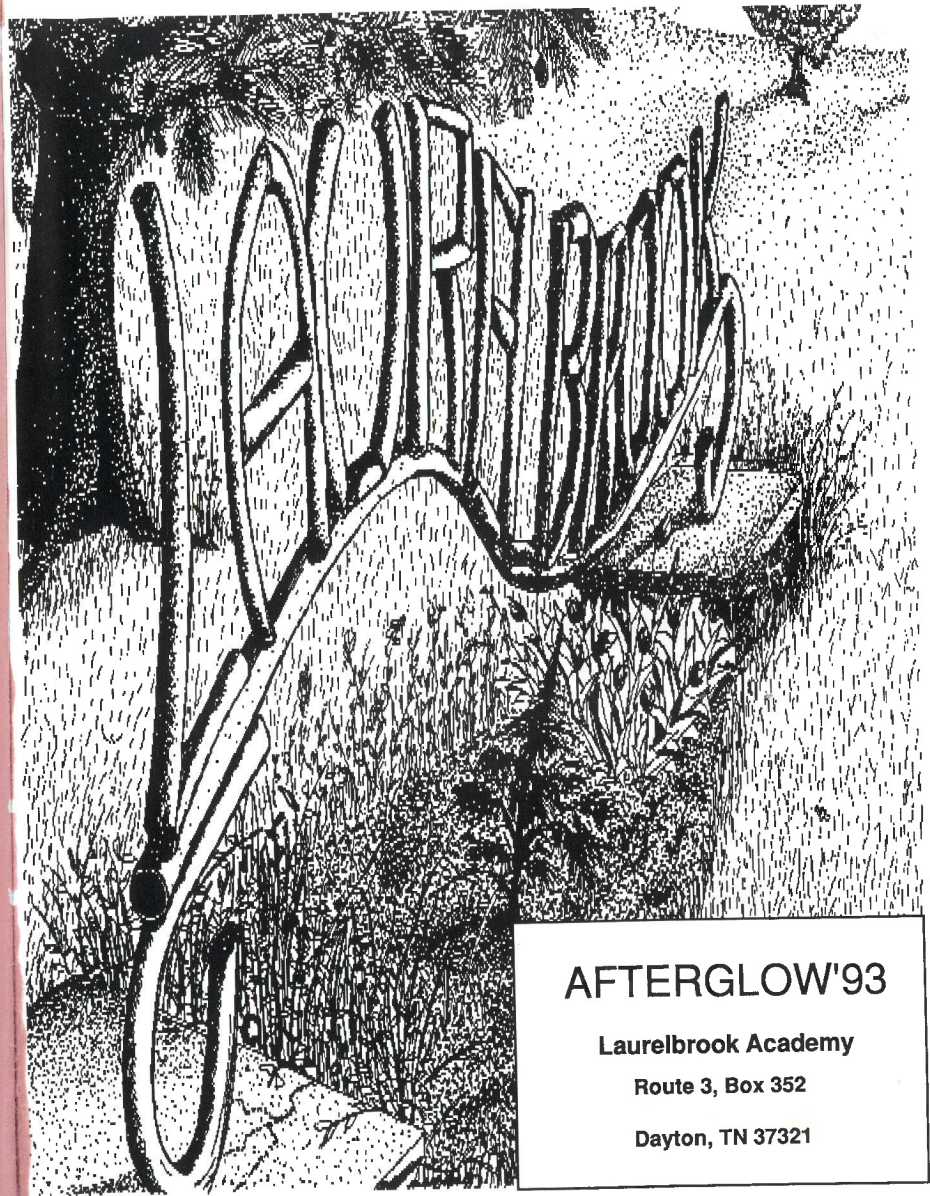

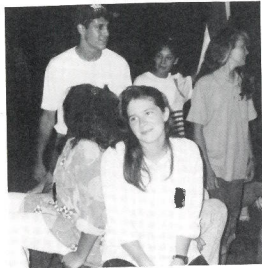

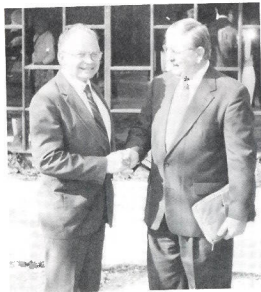


WE ARE MANY,

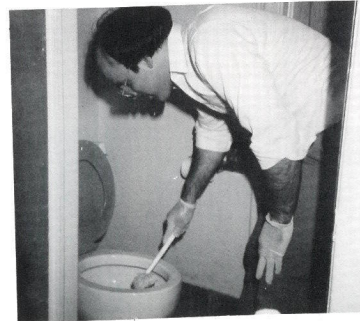

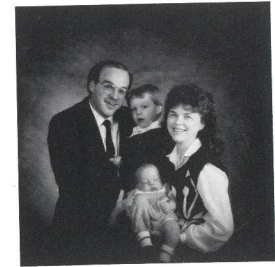

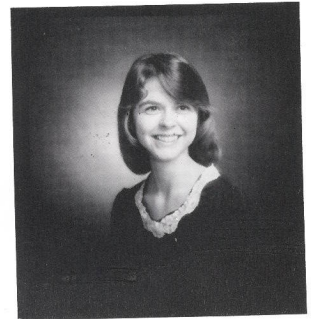

Dear Staff and Students,

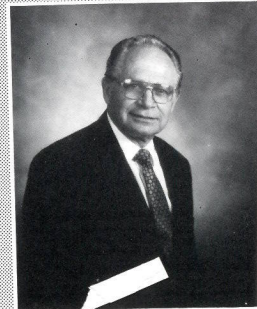
