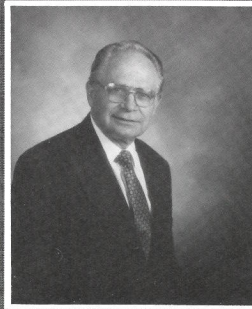
The reason Laurelbrook is here is to help young people develop the character for heaven. It is my desire that each staff and student will encourage and help each other to be ready when Jesus comes.

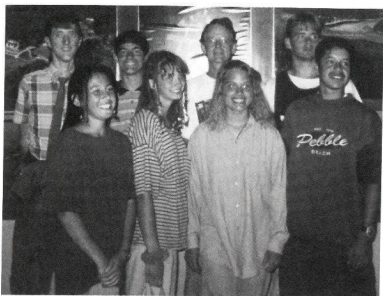
