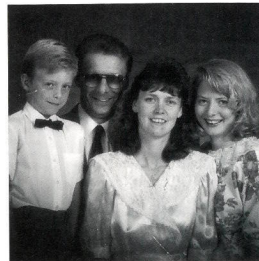

In Search of Yesterday

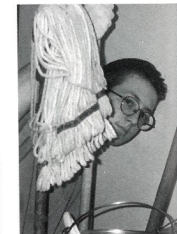

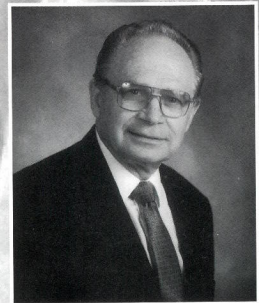
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Group 3 - Amy Bennett (editor), Mark Waugh (computer operator), and Jared Steele and Jennifer Phillips (helpers)

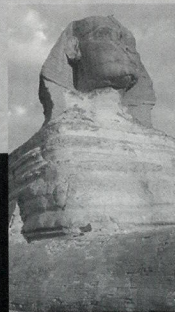
