





Balma Julia Williamson Allen Bamberger Born: July 30, 1907 Died: November 9, 1998

Mrs. Bamberger grew up in Savannah, Georgia as one of five children. She became a Seventh-day Adventist as a teenager and took nursing at Florida Hospital, beginning at age 17. This was her first experience in Christian education. She married and had one son - Earl Allen and ended up raising him alone. As an RN, she had experience working with many famous doctors, one being Dr. John Harvey Kellogg in Miami, Florida.

When her son graduated from Forest Lake Academy, she remarried, this time to Walter Bamberger. About 1981, they came to Laurelbrook where Walter died a short time later. She stayed, volunteered at the Sanitarium, and

filled the remainder of her days blessing others. She prayed. praised God, even thanked God for the problems that came to her. "A Prayer Warrior" and "A Mother in Israel" are a few of the names she was called. If you were discouraged, she encouraged and prayed with you; if you were happy, she laughed with you.

Illness made it necessary for her to be admitted in the

spring of 1998 to the Laurelbrook Nursing Home. Herson then moved her in September to North Carolina where she died in November.

A memorial service was held at the Laurelbrook Cemetery. She is buried beside her husband waiting for the call of her Friend Jesus.


