FIRE DEPARTMENT

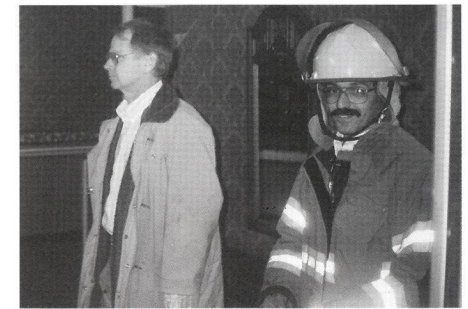

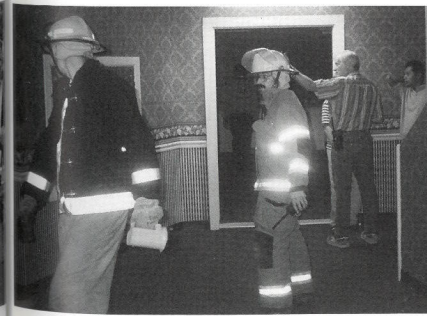

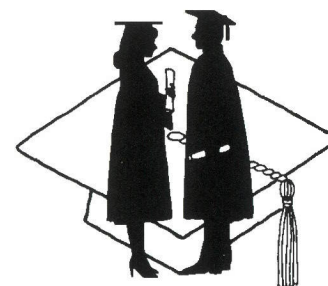
A Message from the Seniors

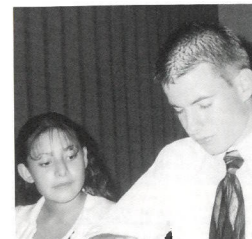
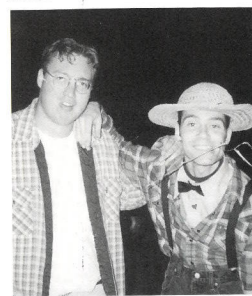
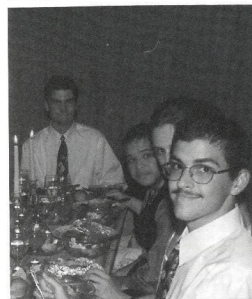
