
This year's annual is dedicated to a very special person. Some people know him as a pastor, some as a mentor, but all know him as a

For all you have given to us, for all you have done for us, for all you mean to us, we dedicate this annual to you, Pastor Walker.



Tribute to Mrs. Magdelena Peick

Magdalena Peick was born in the little German town of Horn on November 18, 1905, the oldest of three children. When she was four, and before her youngest brother was born, their father was killed in a mining accident. Her grandmother, also a widow, helped raise the children so her mother could earn a living. Although poor, her mother was highly respected in the area, sitting on the town council for several years. An aunt living in America persuaded the family to emigrate to the United States while the boys were still in their teens. Magdalena stayed behind in



German to care for her aged grandmother and apprentice as a cook in a famous German restaurant.

At age 24, after her grandmother's death, she joined her mother and brothers in New York and resided there until she moved to Tennessee just before coming to Laurelbrook. She met her husband Henry at a Baptist church in New York. He had just come from Germany. Although they never had any children of their own they raised her youngest brother's child when his wife developed a mental illness from which she never recovered.

For many years, she did infant nursing, going into private homes for two to four weeks to care for newborns while the mother recuperated; she also worked as a cook for the Greater New York Conference during their various summer camps and conventions. She worked in a knitting mill and spent her last ten years in New York working as a Bible worker among German immigrants. She was an active church worker, serving as a Sabbath School teacher, superintendent, and treasurer. During World War II, she organized a "care package" team at the church, helping to save the lives of many people with the staple foods she and her husband purchased at great personal sacrifice and mailed to impoverished family and

When her husband's mental health declined to the point where she could not manage him at home and continue her work, they came to Laurelbrook and admitted him into the nursing home. Magdalena was then 60 years old, and for the next 20 years she was the head of the housekeeping department in the nursing home. Tante ("aunt" in German) Lena, as she was affectionately known, trained many students in the fine art of keeping things spotless. "If you aren't able to eat your dinner off the toilet seat, you haven't cleaned it well enough" was a favorite

Magdalena had a beautiful high soprano voice as a young girl and loved to sing. In later years, she sang mostly alto and lost her range, but her love for both music and cooking never abated. She would host each class to a dinner at her home very year, an event always anticipated eagerly. After 16 years of retirement at Laurelbrook, failing health made necessary her admission to the nursing home last February where she celebrated her 97th birthday on November 18, 2002. --- Ruth B. Zollinger






