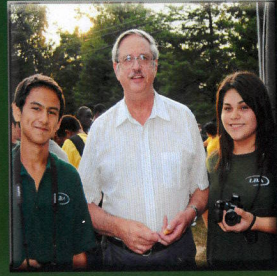
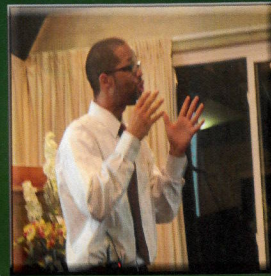
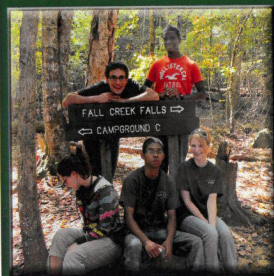
Academics

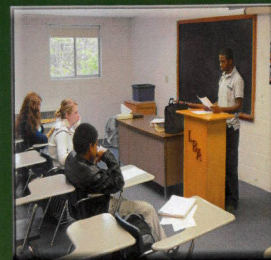
Vocational Training

This yearbook is dedicated to you, Ms. Dorka Ubiera.



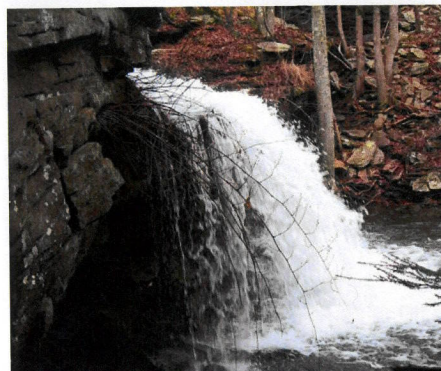

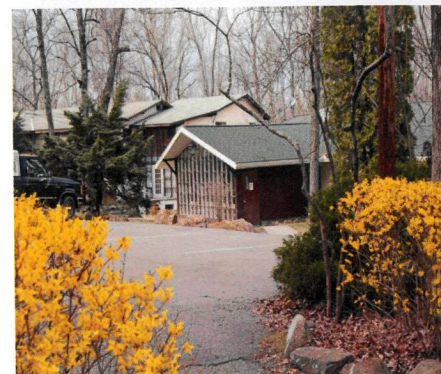

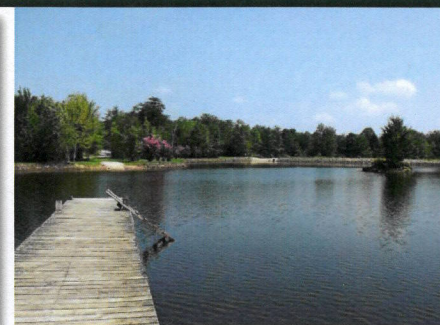

Pastor David Wendt and his wife Joy

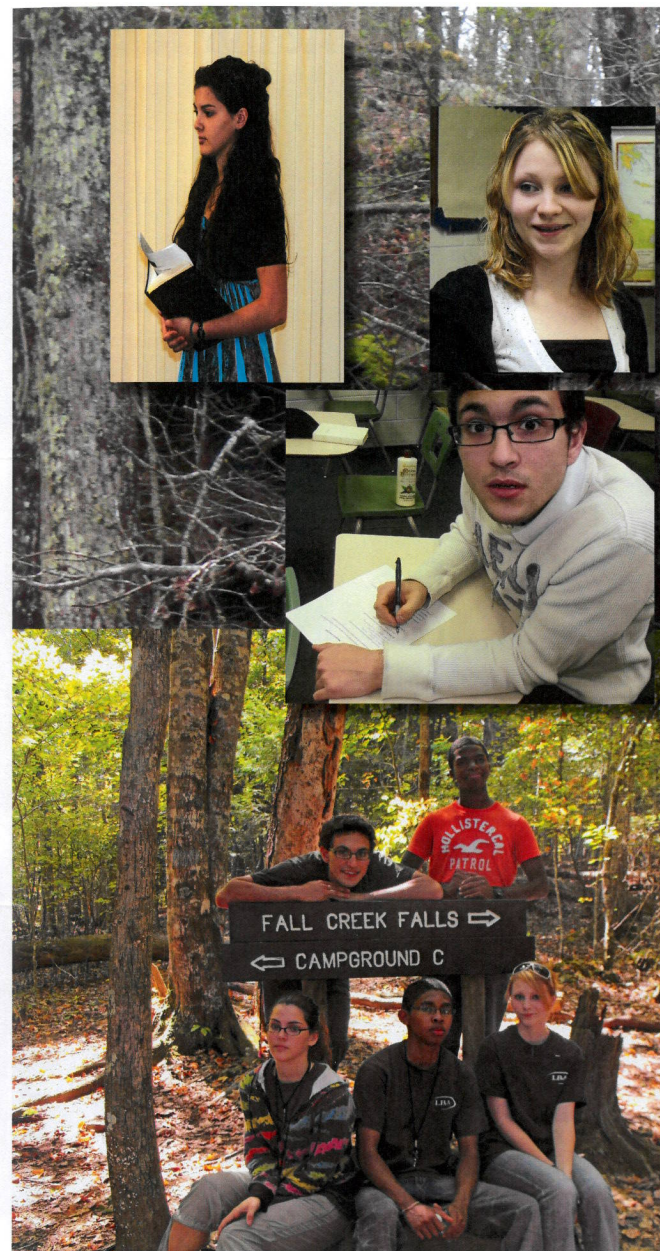

Tribute to Florence Paulk

1919 - December 15, 2010



Florence Paulk was born in San Diego, California in 1919 and married Robert Thompson at age 22. As a young woman, she played for many church services and directed many musical groups – she even played for the King's Heralds Quartet and H.M.S. Richards, Sr. Eventually she had four children, all of whom were all sent to Seventh-day Adventist schools, including Walla Walla College (now University). Eventually, too, she became interested in Adventist education, becoming a girls' dean at Stone Cave and Laurelbrook academies, developing greenhouse operations at each school, and teaching teenagers to enjoy art and music.

Through her life, she developed skills in several very different areas. In California, she developed a major garden attraction, getting her oldest son Chris to help her in the business. Often she woke him up at 4:00 a.m. to help her. Chris

remembers hoeing the various paths to get rid of the weeds. As soon as he finished with all the paths, it was time to start over. She was a faithful student of scripture and often targeted Baptist and Catholic church personnel, trying to get them to see the truths of the Bible. Along with all her other skills, she was a poet.

Florence developed her art skills, eventually selling about 500 paintings. Wanda Sarr remembers that her favorite painting was one showing raccoons. Nothing is impossible to a raccoon, and Florence felt as much drive and willingness to get a job done as any raccoon.

She married Walter Squire and lost him about eleven years ago. In 2004, her children gathered to wish her well with a big celebration dinner on Sabbath. Five months later she was married to Wilbur Paulk. Pastor Coulter was given definite instructions to keep the service short and to turn up the volume to help Wilbur's hearing. Wilbur's fun helped with the increasing pain with her years increased.

After retiring, she played organ and piano in the Laurelbrook church, assisting Charles Sarr with Laurelbrook's music program. Friends were so important to her, especially in the sunset years of her life. She had lots of friends since she was a friendly person even though she outlived most of her friends. Handshakes, hugs, flower arrangements, dishes of food – all showed her friendship.

Every year she had a Christmas party for the campus retirees until her husband Wilbur put his foot down and said it was getting too much for her. These gatherings were noted for luscious food and good fellowship. Florence preferred to entertain rather than be entertained.

And she was noted for her stories. Clifton Brandt remembers one story that involved a Pathfinder group who were going on a backpacking trip. They were to have camped out and let the ranger know the schedule. Florence was given the impression the group should not go on that trip. They waited around the campsite – around noon the ranger truck came to the camp. There had been a huge landslide where the group was to have camped, and the ranger was very happy to see the group hadn't gone on their planned trip.

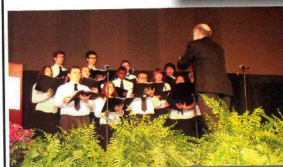
