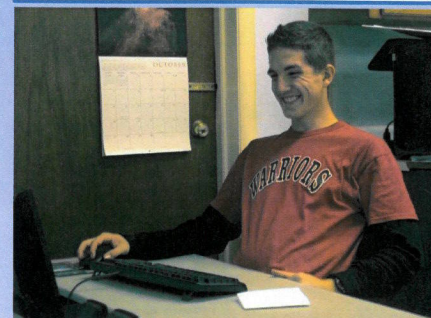


## YEARBOOK STAFF

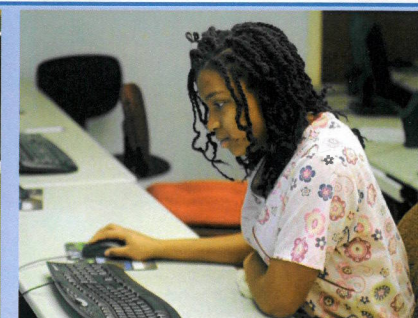


Aaron (left) and Matlin (in consultation with Sarah) were on the yearbook staff for the first semester. Denisse (far right) joined the staff the second semester.
