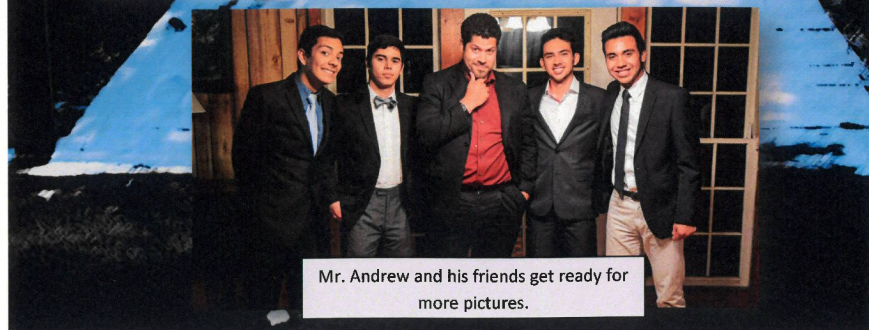

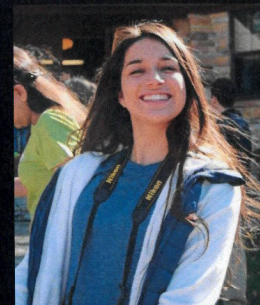
We must always remember that God has told us; "without me you can do nothing." John 14:5; but "with God all things are possible." Matthew 19:26

Seniors, staff, and students, as you continue on life's journey, hold fast, to the only One who can see you through, our Savior Jesus Christ.

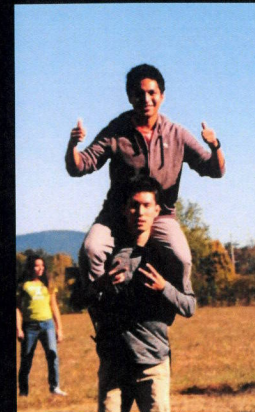

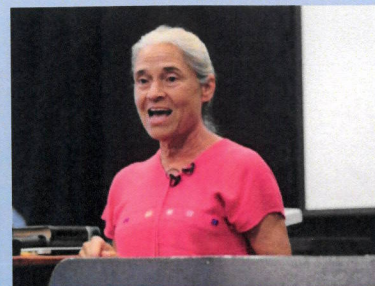

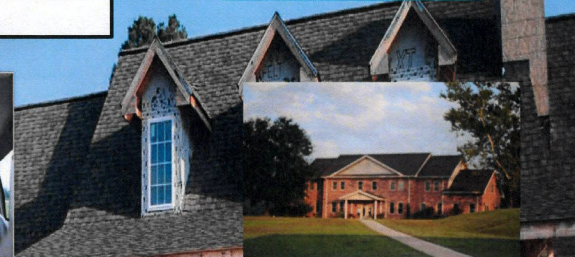

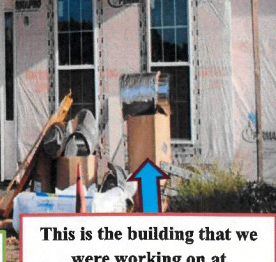

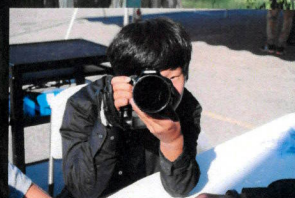

Tribute to Jack Bernard Faatz

October 3, 1922 - June 30, 2016



Jack Bernard Faatz, a long-time campus resident and retired staff member, was laid to rest in the Laurelbrook Cemetery in a graveside ceremony on July 3, 2016. He was 93. A memorial service followed in the Laurelbrook Seventh-day Adventist Church. He was survived by three daughters, one son, and a loving wife.

Jack Faatz's life developed in three phases. In Phase One, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy during World War II for a term of six years. This meant that when the fighting was over he was still obligated to stay in the Navy for a time. From his naval service came his lifelong love of boats and the sea.

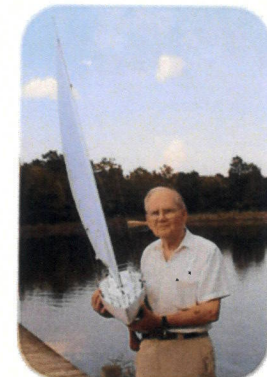
In the Navy, he fought violent Pacific storms and met Louise, his wife of 72 years. Louise Faatz noticed that Jack was not a very romantic sailor but very businesslike. He figured if the marriage didn't work out he could get a divorce. But he turned out to be a perfectionist, a wonderful husband and provider, and the one God had picked out for her.

Jack loved working with wood as well as sailing.

After his Navy stint, he settled in Florida and went into the prosthetics business, making artificial limbs. During his Florida years and even afterward, Jack Faatz shaped a lot of people's lives by having a keen interest in people and by observing people. Fifty-six years ago Kenneth Coonley became acquainted with Jack. Jack offered him a job making artificial limbs, helped Kenneth build his confidence, and helped him with various issues. Eventually Kenneth became a partner in the business until the two sold the business and went on to other things.

John Gilbreath was in 5th grade and a member of Jack's Sabbath School class when he had a memorable encounter with Jack. One week Jack asked John to memorize some scripture verses, but John forgot. John was told that he was expected to take part personally in the Sabbath School. Jack asked John to mow his lawn and various other things, and eventually John became a part-time employee of Jack's.

Eventually, Jack and Kenneth decided to leave the business and go onto other activities. Jack moved with his family to Laurelbrook, and Kenneth went into the ministry. Phase Three of Jack's life had begun.

At Laurelbrook, Jack Faatz became the head of the institutional purchasing department, buying everything from books to bricks, always carefully staying within budget. People often learned that if you asked him to buy twelve hammers, he would buy six.

At Laurelbrook, the Faatz family built a house with a large living room so they could have the students over. They often had a full house because they were always entertaining all sorts of people coming to look for employment, attending graduations and other ceremonies, or just passing through. Ron Oxentenko remembers that the family helped him and his brothers with club fees although the group was slightly rebellious.

Eventually Jack Faatz retired from the purchasing department and lived out the rest of his life helping others and attending the Laurelbrook church, sitting in a special place in a back corner of the church sanctuary until one day that corner was empty.

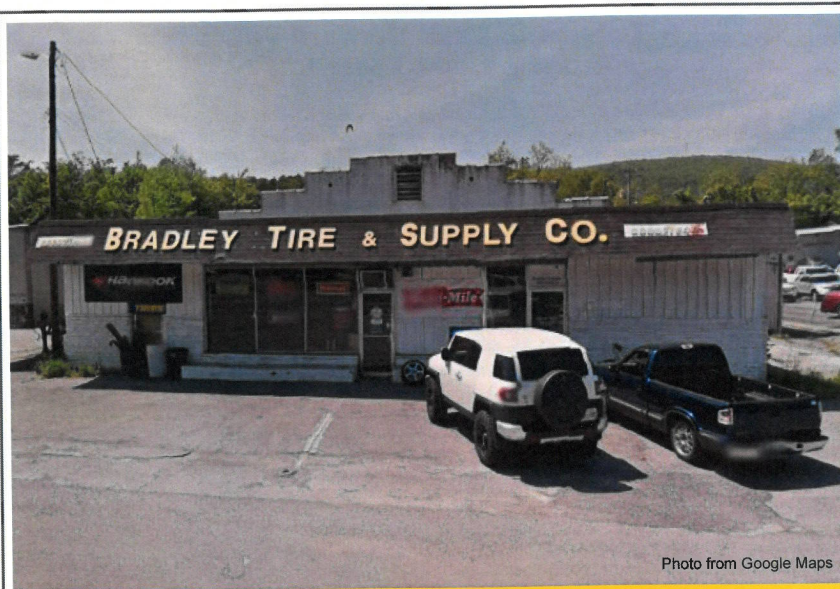

Tribute to Elsie Ruth Zollinger

April 16, 1938 – August 11, 2016



Elsie Ruth Zollinger, Mrs. Ruthie as she was known, was the wife of long-time Laurelbrook president Robert D. Zollinger and a friend and inspiration to hundreds of Laurelbrook students. She was remembered in a memorial service on September 17, 2016 in the school auditorium. She was 78. She is survived by her husband of 58 years, two sons, one daughter, and hundreds of friends.

Mrs. Ruthie was born on April 6, 1938 in Tampa, Florida, the last of six children. She attended Tampa Junior Academy and then studied elementary education at Madison College near Nashville, TN. She was sent to Laurelbrook School to get experience as a teacher and as a girls' dean. But instead of returning to Madison, she stayed on at Laurelbrook's request.

Perhaps not by coincidence, she married Robert D. Zollinger the following year, and the couple spent 58 years working at Laurelbrook. As the president's wife, she shared Mr. Bob's administrative duties and planned many of the school's activities – Bible Conferences, workshops, birthday celebrations, dorm worship, trips to concerts, town trips, vesper programs, yearbooks, and Christmas parties, just to name a few of her wide-ranging activities. Through those 58 years, many students stayed in her home and felt her influence.

In her work, Mrs. Ruthie reached beyond the restlessness of youth or the insecurity of new staff members to see what that person might become, treating each as an individual. She specialized in helping others do better, counseling, correcting, and befriending them as she did so. Instead of doing all the leadership duties herself, she tried to organize activities so that students or new staff members could be trained as leaders.

Mrs. Ruthie was the heart and soul of the Zollinger family – and the family felt it. Despite all the pressures and duties, she stayed close to Jesus and took her burdens to Him. And she passed the comfort she received from Jesus on to her family and friends.


In his book on Laurelbrook history, Mr. Bob tells a typical story of how her influence and closeness to Jesus helped the school to grow. At this time, Laurelbrook was building a girls' dorm, but there was a problem – where would the money come from for windows? One evening Mr. Bob answered the phone while Mrs. Ruthie went to prayer

bands. Mr. Bob's Uncle Hick called to tell him that there was a lot of windows in Chattanooga for \$110, the result of a train wreck. Mr. Bob authorized the purchase. There were just enough windows to furnish the entire girls' dorm building. Her prayer bands had made the difference.



Mrs. Ruthie was a woman of grace – a tall, slender, elegant woman exuding the grace of God and a proper role model for many young people. **Proverbs 31:10-12** "Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price is far above rubies. The heart of her husband doth safely trust in her, so that he shall have no need of spoil. She will do him good and not evil all the days of her life."

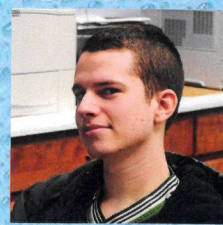

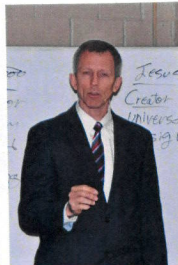

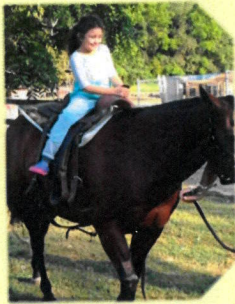
