FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

The value of perseverance was emphasized by Theodore Roosevelt in his speech, “The Citizenship in a Republic”, delivered at Sorbonne, Paris, on April 23, 1910. himself in a worthy cause; who at the best knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who know neither victory nor defeat...”

You and I live in the arena of the great controversy between good and evil, in an unceasing struggle “against spiritual hosts of wickedness” (Ephesians 6:12). Regardless of how talented and persistent we are, our best efforts in this battle will certainly fail if not strengthened and guided by God’s almighty power.

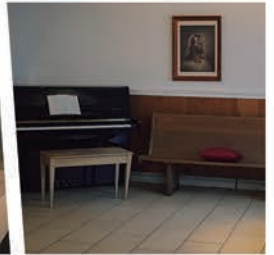
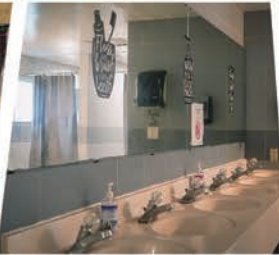
The dorm is a special place for each of the students. It is our home at Laurelbrook, our place to rest, to study, but also to have fun among brothers.

After the devastation caused by Hurricane Ian in Florida, a team of students and staff from LBA, trained to respond to disasters, traveled to the affected areas and joined the Emergency Response Team, The Distribution Points, as in all disaster responses in the United States, are coordinated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and in this case they got support from the LBA team.

The Alumni association is currently raising money for a scholarship endowment that will allow more students to attend Laurelbrook.

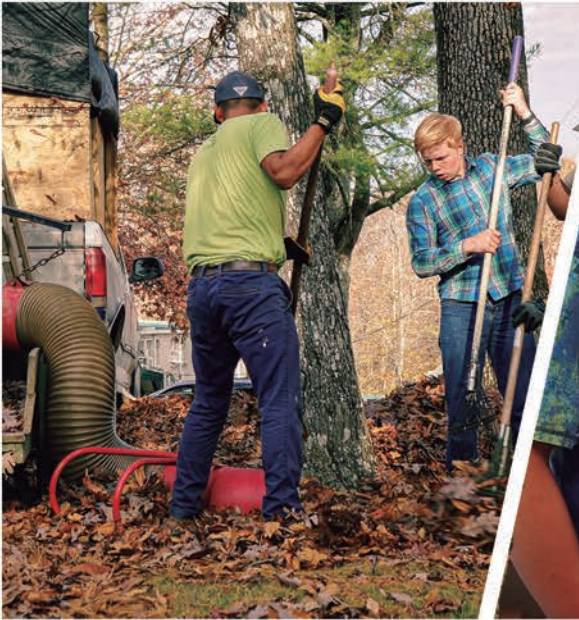


This year, the Alumni event was extraordinary not only because of the number of graduates who visited us, but also because of the joy of the meeting.

VOCATIONAL



The vocational program underwent some important developments this year. It now includes a more educational structure in order to diligently assess students' knowledge, skills, and work ethic.

Our mission to train and equip students with skills, experience, and a solid work ethic undergirds our vocational training. With four hours daily on weekdays, the students are assigned to areas such as Agriculture, Food Services, Maintenance, Construction, Housekeeping, Grounds Management, Office Procedures, CNA, and others. On Fridays, they are trained in specialized areas that include Media Production, Music, Firefighting, Small Engines & Auto Mechanics, Literature Evangelism, and Carpentry. To top it off, we have added two outdoor programs: Rock Climbing and Park Ranger. Laurelbrook has an abundance of land with woods, rocky walls and cliffs, hills and mountains, creeks and falls, trails, and much more.

FARM

Our unwavering focus is to train young people and produce healthy nutritious organic veggies and root crops for our academy kitchen, commissary, and Nursing Home.



The Laurelbrook Academy farm is one of the key pillars of the institution for training and imparting young people with practical farming knowledge and skills.

Our current operation is small with a total of four acres for cultivation, one fully-heated greenhouse, and a prop house for a nursery. We were blessed this with two more greenhouses from ASI. We also got our new tractor, which is capable of using all the working farm implements that we have. We are working on a strategic plan to grow more outdoor crops in the coming summer and onwards.

Firefighting

The Junior Firefighter Program at Laurelbrook Academy trains students to become first responders in emergencies.



We help these young minds understand the real world applications to becoming a firefighter. Teamwork, community outreach, and service are emphasized. Basic firefighting training with hands-on applications such as simulated car fires, search & rescue, and the proper use of tools, fire extinguishers, and prevention awareness gives each young person a real look at what is required to be a first responder. Upon completion of this program, not only will each student have become certified in CPR but will also have the skill set, knowledge, and understanding every firefighter should have to begin a career. The goal is to instill a stronger sense of pride within the community.

OUTDOOR

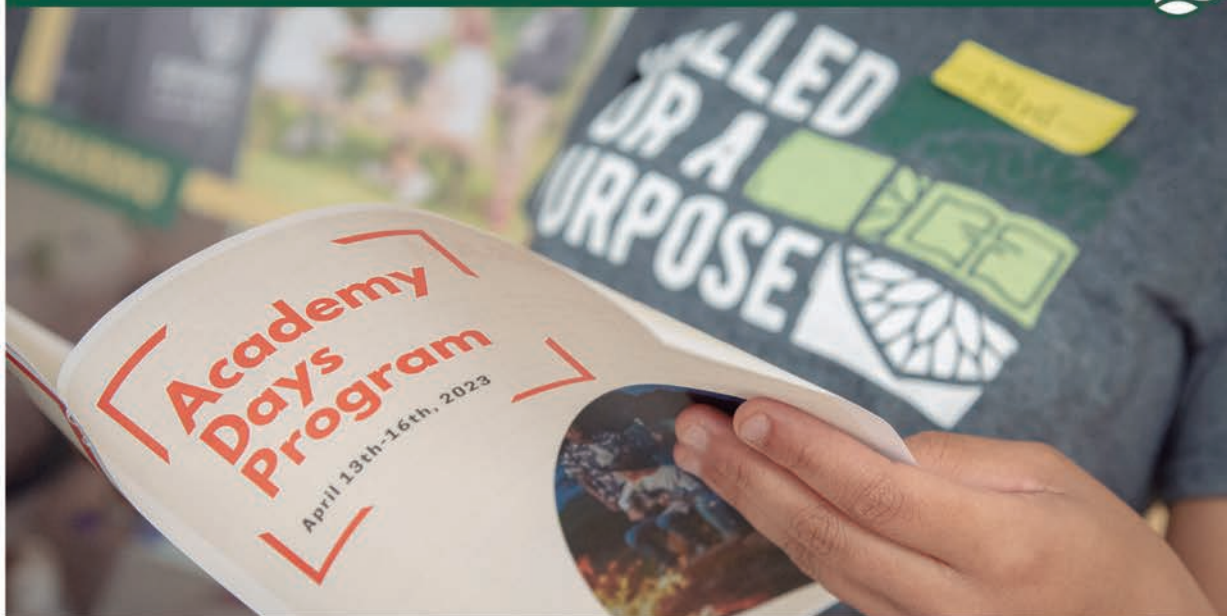
Hidden away in our forests are trickling waterfalls, secluded hiking trails, breathtaking clifftop vistas, and flourishing gardens.

Besides Academics and the Vocational Program, our goal for students is to allow them to know Jesus better, to have a closer relationship with Him, and to share their faith with others.

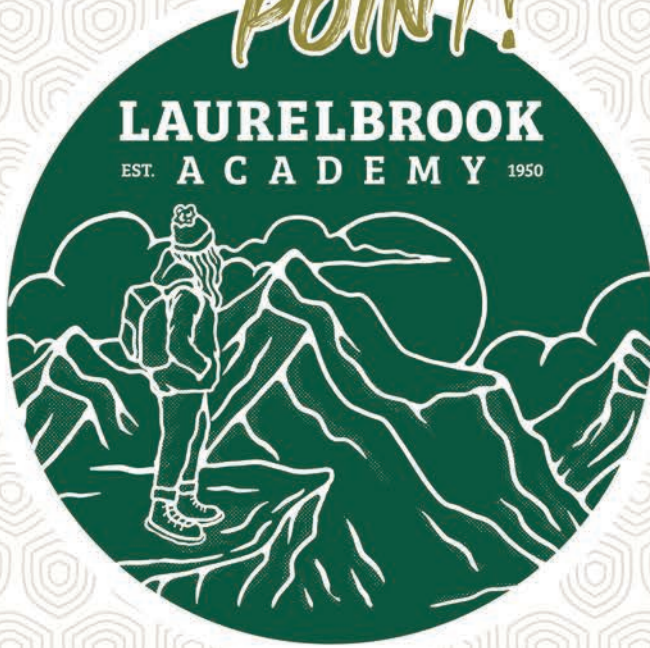
